Legislative Activity Details

Adoption (Extension of Eligibility Criteria) Amendment Regulation 2016 (No. 206 of 2016) [QLD]

The objective of the Adoption (Extension of Eligibility Criteria) Amendment Regulation 2016 (Amendment Regulation) is to support the commencement of the Adoption and Other Legislation Amendment Act 2016 (AOLA Act) which amends the Adoption Act 2009.

The AOLA Act extends eligibility criteria in the Adoption Act 2009 to allow same-sex couples, single persons and persons undergoing fertility treatment to express an interest in adopting a child. The Amendment Regulation proposes minor amendments to the Adoption Regulation 2009 (Adoption Regulation) to align the Adoption Regulation with amendments in the AOLA Act which allow single persons to express an interest and be selected and assessed as suitable adoptive parents.

A Bill for an Act to amend the Biological Control Act 1986 to make it clear that viruses and sub-viral agents are included within the definition of an organism for the purpose of biological control to manage targeted pests. The amendments address an issue that has arisen about the classification of viruses and sub-viral agents as living organisms and the possible legal implications this might have for agent and target organism declarations made under the biological control acts.

[Draft] Liquor Licensing (Liquor Review) Amendment Bill 2016 [SA]

The South Australian Government is planning sweeping changes to the State's liquor laws in response to the first review of the Liquor Licensing Act in around two decades. Proposed changes include:

- Streamlining liquor licensing categories.
- Removing restrictions relating to the sale of liquor on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday and New Year's Eve.
- Tightening the laws relating to the supply of alcohol to minors.
- Introducing a mandatory three hour break in trade for late night premises between 3:00 am and 8:00 am.

The Government also intends to introduce a new test based on the concept of community interest to be used in the assessment of certain high-risk applications, such as an application to grant a licence in respect of premises proposing to operate as a nightclub.

A Bill for an Act to make provision for the registration of certain relationships; to make consequential, related and other amendments.

The Bill implements recommendations made by South Australian Law Reform Institute (SALRI). The Bill will create an option for couples in any relationship to more easily demonstrate their status when dealing with various bodies, including government agencies and service providers, in order to have their relationship rightly respected and to access their rights and entitlements.

NOTE: Contingently on the Relationships Register Bill 2016 (No 158) being committed to a Committee of the whole House it was moved as an instruction to the Committee of the whole House on the Bill that it have power to divide the Bill into two Bills - one Bill to be referred to as the Statutes Amendment (Surrogacy Eligibility) Bill 2016 (No 158) comprising Schedule 1 Part 2 clause 2 [Amendment of Assisted Reproductive Treatment Act 1988], Schedule 1 Part 5 clause 5 (4) [part of the Amendment of the Equal Opportunity Act 1984] and Schedule 1 Part 6 clauses 21 to 27 inclusive [Amendment of Family Relationships Act 1975]; and the second Bill to be referred to as the Relationships Register (No. 1) Bill 2016 (No 1750 comprising the balance of the original Bill, and that it be an instruction to the Committee of the whole House on the Statutes Amendment (Surrogacy Eligibility) Bill that it have power to insert the words of enactment.
